

Howard Gleckman is the author of *Caring for Our Parents* (St. Martin's Press) and is a Senior Fellow at The Urban Institute, where he is affiliated with both the Tax Policy Center and the Program on Retirement Policy.

He is the author the Urban-Brookings Tax Policy Center's fiscal policy blog *Tax Vox* and a weekly blog on aging issues for *Forbes.com*.

He speaks and writes frequently on long-term care and on tax policy. He has published articles in *The Washington Post*, *USA Today*, *Health Affairs*, *Health Progress*, *Kaiser Health News*, *The Hill*, *The Milken Review*, and the *AARP Bulletin*.
